

County Teams Report 2016

This is my third report as County Match Secretary. The role and functions of this post have been discussed previously so I won't repeat them; however I'll happily send a copy of the 2015 & 2014 reports to anyone who didn't receive one.

Anyway on to Season 2015-16. We entered the same teams as last year namely Minor Counties, Under 160, Under 140, Under 120 and Under 100 plus having an Under 180 team held in reserve. Our teams swept everything before them in the Midlands. We drew our opening match against Leicestershire in the Minor Counties followed by 14 successive wins. Consequently we won all five Midland titles – the Under 160, Under 140, Under 120 and Under 100 all with 100% scores. We even had the luxury of playing an Under 180 match which, as we'd qualified by winning the Minor, we fielded a weakened team and suffered a rare loss.

It might be thought that with this in mind we might march into the National qualifiers with a repeat performance to the finals. Not to be I'm afraid.

Our Minor team is simply not strong enough to play competitively. The strongest possible team we could field (average grade 175) lost narrowly to Norfolk by 9-7. The county's strongest players will not represent the county and that is why Lincolnshire, with 10 players graded 180+ in their side, are in the final and not us. Our 160s lost narrowly in the quarter-finals to Surrey – to date our second string side has simply never found form at this stage. Our Under 140s, our most successful team, had reached the national final in both 2014 & 2015. After beating Hertfordshire convincingly in the quarters we faced Worcestershire, the Midlands 3rd qualifier in the semi-finals having beaten them 10-6 in the regional round. Notts were described as "firm favourites" especially as the team-sheet showed we outgraded them on every board by an average of some seven points. The match finished with a disastrous reversal of the original score; we lost the top eight boards 6-2 scoring just four draws. The Under 100s had a bye to the semi-finals but lost to Essex. However our Under 120s, national champions in 2014, progressed to the final by beating Surrey and Norfolk. We now face Warwickshire who, of course, we have already beaten this season – let's hope that they don't follow Worcestershire's example!

I have explained at some length in an e-mail how difficult it is to maintain the high standard that we have set. Problems include people who don't/won't answer e-mails; players who withdraw with days or in some cases hours of a match; this year we've had defaults as well which we will incur fines for.

Finally a cautionary note. I cannot do this job forever and indeed I am cutting back on my admin jobs. I intend to put in another three years should the Association wish me to continue and should I be fit enough to carry on. So please note this for the future!
